Did you know ?

The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs has recently acknowledged that service connection for hearing loss is NOT predicated on the service member having a significant hearing loss upon separating from the military. The VA concedes that hearing loss, which develops long after service, may have been caused by acoustic nerve trauma experienced while performing specific duties in the military. The VA requires 3 items: 1 – Documented significant hearing loss from audiologist, 2 – Statement from veteran concerning their job in military and how it produced the trauma (combat, artillery, submariner etc) and 3 – Statement from ENT doctor which supports claim. If you feel you qualify, or have questions, contact me and I will assist you!

Greetings all! This may actually be one of my shortest newsletters to date. With the hot and rainy weather and many members traveling over the summer months we have not had many organized rides, but hopefully as fall and better weather approach that will change.

On June 23<sup>rd</sup> we held our annual membership drive pizza party. The event was well attended and many members renewed their membership.

On July 13<sup>th</sup>, along with the other Post

officers, our newly elected officers were sworn in at the formal installation ceremony. This was a wonderful event to be a part of, and the buffet after was superb. The cake was especially beautiful, decorated with the emblems of the Legion, SAL, Auxiliary, and ALR. Oh, it was pretty tasty too!

On Saturday, June 25<sup>th</sup>, Steve Small, Anne Pellegrini, and myself attended the Department of Florida Annual Convention at the Caribe Royal resort in Orlando (a very nice locale if you are visiting the area). In addition to attending the general session, we joined other Florida ALR chapters for a special meeting. We received updates on Riders activities at the state and national level.

I am proud to share the following information with you. The ALR is the fastest growing organization within the American Legion, and we are doing great things. Here are some facts: The riders were founded in Garden City Michigan in 1993. Since that time we have grown to 1000 chapters with 106,000 members nationally. The Riders participate in many events at the local, state, and national level, including Rolling Thunder in Washington, D.C. The riders raise money for VA hospitals, women, children, and youth centers, and numerous local charities. A post in Kansas founded the Patriot Guard Riders; well know for attending the funerals of fallen soldiers to protect grieving family members from the actions of protesters.

One of the Rider's biggest events is the Annual Legacy Run. Thousands of members ride from National Headquarters in Indianapolis to the annual convention city, this year in Minneapolis. The riders present donations at the convention to the Legacy Scholarship fund. To date, we have raised over two million dollars for this fund that provides scholarships for the children of service members who have died since 09/11.

At the state level, we have 74 chapters with 3256 members. Last year we rode 787,000 miles, served over 80,000 volunteer hours, and donated \$340,000 to 30 different organizations and programs.

I wanted to give you this information to show you that like our brothers and sisters in the SAL and Auxiliary, we are here to do good works in support of the Legion and its many programs. We aren't just a bunch of guys and gals who ride motorcycles and wear funny vests with lots of patches and pins. We are your fellow members and are here to support our Post and all its works. As a pin on my vest says: "Serving and Riding".

If you haven't noticed, our new shelter has been installed in the "Hog Pen". This permanent aluminum structure should provide protection from the elements for years to come. We are in the process of repairing the picnic tables, and adding some shelves to the vertical supports for use as a place to set your drink or rest your elbows. We hope all the legion members will take advantage and enjoy the full use of the shelter for meetings, cookouts, or just getting some fresh air.

As always, I invite you to join us if you ride, and if you don't, hop on for a spin if you'd like to experience the joy of two-wheel travel. Please watch out for motorcycles whenever and wherever you travel. See you at the Post!


